102

103 5.1 The IBC shall have at least 2 Full-time Scientists specializing in accelerators or accelerator-
104 based science and technology, 2 Full-time technical support staff and 1 Full-time Radiation
105 Safety Officer at all times. They will constitute the "Core Staff" of the IBC.
106

107 5.2 It will be primarily the responsibility of the University to make the "Core Staff" available for
108 the IBC.
109

110 5.3 In case the University is not able to readily provide the "Core Staff" for any reason, IUAC
111 shall post its staff at the IBC pending appointment of such staff by the University. UGC shall
112 grant some additional posts to IUAC for such purposes.
113

114 5.4 All University staff working at IBC, "Core Staff" or otherwise, shall be hired by the
115 University following its norms and procedures with the addition of an IUAC nominee on the
116 Selection Committee constituted for hiring such staff. Such staff shall be governed by the
117 service conditions of the University and shall be paid by the University.
118

119 5.5 All IUAC staff at IBC, "Core Staff" or otherwise, shall be hired by IUAC following its
120 norms and procedures with the addition of a nominee from one of the IBCs on the Selection
121 Committee constituted for hiring such staff. Such staff shall be governed by the service
122 conditions of IUAC and shall be paid by IUAC.
123

124 5.6 All IUAC Staff posted at the IBC shall be under the local administrative control of the
125 Director/Head/In-charge, IBC and the Vice-Chancellor of the University/co-Chair of the
126 Management Committee. The Management Committee shall lay down guidelines for the
127 roles and responsibilities of the staff working in the IBC.
128

129 5.7 Director/Head/In-Charge of the IBC
130

131 5.7.1 The Director/Head/In-Charge of the IBC shall be appointed by a Committee co-chaired
132 by the Vice-Chancellor of the University and Director, IUAC, and having 2 experts as
133 Members, one each nominated by the Vice-Chancellor and Director, IUAC and an
134 Official Nominee of the UGC.

136 5.7.2 The Director/Head/In-Charge of the IBC shall be filled by transfer/posting.
137

138 5.7.3 While selecting the Director/Head/In-Charge of the IBC by transfer/posting, preference
139 will be given to a University Faculty Member having expertise in accelerators or
140 accelerator-based R&D. In case such a person is not available, the post will be filled by
141 posting of an IUAC scientist till the University appoints a suitable faculty member.
142

143 5.7.4 The Director/Head/In-Charge of the IBC shall be responsible for smooth and efficient
144 functioning of IBC as per the directions of the Management Committee.

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6.1 IUAC, through its website and also through the websites of the University, shall invite scientific proposals for beam-time allocation in the format designed for beam-time allocation at IUAC accelerators and facilities (60% of the beam time available with IBC).

6.2 The proposals shall be evaluated by the IUAC National Users Committee for beam-time allocation at the IBC. Memberships and Terms of Reference of the IUAC National Users Committee may be suitably amended to allow for consideration of proposals for beam-time allocation at the IBC.

6.3 40% beam time will be allotted by the IBC to the internal users for which proposals will be invited internally. However, these proposals will be evaluated by the IUAC National users committee. The beam time if remains unutilized shall be distributed by the committee to national users.

1617. Academic Programme/s at the IBC

The IBC may design appropriate post-graduate degree programmes and training programmes on accelerators and accelerator-based science and technology around the facilities available at the IBC. The same may be offered after approval by the Management Committee.

1678. Performance Monitoring of the IBC

8.1 The Management Committee shall monitor the performance of the IBC at least once every year and take corrective steps, as necessary, to improve the functioning of the IBC.


8.2 The Management Committee shall evolve quantitative criteria for monitoring the performance of the IBC. Apart from other criteria, it shall include the following parameters: (i) up-time of the machine and associated facilities; (ii) number of users from the University; (iii) number of users from other institutions in the country; (iv) number of papers published in refereed journals; (v) number of PhDs produced based on work done at the IBC; (vi) number of training programmes conducted; (vii) number of technical personnel trained as a result of training programmes; (viii) number of special degree courses run based on the facility; (ix) number of students produced through special degree courses.


8.3 If, at any time, the Management Committee is convinced that the Director/Head/In-Charge of the IBC has not been able to provide effective leadership for efficient functioning of the IBC. The management committee may appoint another person as the Director/Head/In-Charge of the IBC, after approval of executive council of the University and UGC as per the provisions for the appointment of Director/Head/In-Charge of the IBC mentioned in the MoU.

1879. Changes in this MOU

9.1 The terms and conditions of this MoU may be modified and/or changed with the recommendations of the Management Committee and with formal agreement of the three Parties.

9.2 The modifications in the MoU shall come into effect prospectively and shall not invalidate the decisions taken earlier within the provisions of the MOU at that time.



1. Objectives of MoU

- 1.1 To develop skilled manpower in the specialised domain of Engineering, emerging technologies through conduction of certificate/short-long term training programmes for students, faculty and industry professionals.
- 1.2 To enhance the relationship between the two institutions through the promotion and development of collaborative research programs, academic and cultural exchange programs and other cooperative activities in areas of mutual interest and benefit.
- 1.3 To leverage the expertise of both the institutions to achieve scale and depth in the areas of operation.
- 1.4 To conduct collaborative research and joint academic programs, exchange of documentation, research materials, publications and information in fields of mutual interest.
- 1.5 To facilitate the awareness creation about new innovations/ emerging technologies in the sector and make it more accessible/ available for adoption by the MSMEs.
- 1.6 To impart industry-relevant skills to the manpower engaged in the industry at large.
- 1.7 To organize joint technical events or participate in the events being organized by the other institution in the capacity of technical partner.

2. Scope of MoU

The scope of this MoU shall be collaboration in the fields of skill development, research and consulting. This MoU outlines the broad areas of understanding between the institutions; specific understanding/ agreements could be drawn on a case-to-case basis whenever the need arises during the course of this MoU. The agreement shall be signed between the parties prior to the commencement of work on such cases in writing, defining the rights and responsibilities, time frame, financials, etc. pertaining to both the institutions. The scope broadly is outlined below:

- 2.1 To conduct joint programmes for technology transfer depending on the research and projects undertaken by the institutions.
- 2.2 To hold/conduct, whenever feasible, joint workshops, conferences, training courses within the areas of co-operation.
- 2.3 The concerned officials of both institutes will formulate Research & Development projects for joint work with due approval of both the participating institutions.
- 2.4 Technology transfer and imparting training and internship to staff, students and technical personnel within the areas of co-operation.

- 2.5 Joint sponsored and consultancy projects could be undertaken, with both long term and short-term goals, keeping in view the interests and philosophies of the respective institutions.

3. Details of Programmes/Training/Certification


MSME Technology Centre, Durg and GGV, Bilaspur have jointly agreed for imparting education & training programmes in the field of Engineering & Emerging Technologies and offering related services in the approved premises of Institutions on mutually accepted terms and conditions based on approval of the competent authority.

4. Responsibility of GGV, Bilaspur

- 4.1 To provide expertise in designing and formulating the course structure and syllabus for mutually agreed on domains/technologies in consultation with the MSME Technology Centre Durg. This can be modified and finalised as per the needs of the programme based upon mutual consultation and agreement and the finalisation of the programme shall be done by a joint committee of MSME Technology Centre Durg and GGV Bilaspur.
- 4.2 GGV, Bilaspur shall mobilise and enrol students for such courses as per mutually agreed criteria and the number of students mentioned in the agreement.
- 4.3 The tuition and other fees/charges for these courses shall be prescribed by GGV Bilaspur from time to time with the concurrence of MSME Technology Centre Durg.
- 4.4 GGV Bilaspur shall be responsible to promote the certification/joint certification, short term, medium term, and long-term training programs.

5. Responsibility of MSME Technology Centre Durg

- 5.1 To jointly propose and engage in applied research or training programmes sponsored by funding agencies.
- 5.2 MSME Technology Centre, Durg to exchange information on teaching, learning material and other literature relevant to their educational & applied research programs.
- 5.3 Assess the technologies available with GGV Bilaspur and explore the possibility of commercialization of those technologies amongst the industry networks.
- 5.4 Facilitating interaction with the industry in case GGV, Bilaspur needs that as part of their projects.



- 5.5 Customized courses/ training programs for students, faculty and industry professionals.
- 5.6 Provide internship to students of GGV, Bilaspur on mutually agreed terms and conditions.

6. Joint Responsibility

- 6.1 To decide on the number of programmes, curriculum, eligibility criteria, admission process, student intake in each course and fees to be charged from students etc.
- 6.2 To formulate the programme structure and syllabi of the courses to be taught in the said certification programmes and identify faculty from both institutions and industry as well for delivering the content of the programmes smoothly including the lab and project work. The delivery process shall be decided on mutual consultations for every batch.
- 6.3 Ensure direct interface with one another without involving any external agency or specialists.
- 6.4 Both the parties should work together to building up a long-term working relationship rather than associating for immediate benefits.
- 6.5 Both the parties shall take all reasonable steps to ensure the successful completion of the collaboration and co-operate with each other in duly carrying out the obligations agreed upon.

7. Sharing of Facilities

- 7.1 The two institutes agree to share their respective R&D facilities in order to promote academic and research interactions.
- 7.2 The two institutes agree to exchange software, other materials and components developed in house, if advisable within the framed rules governing the two institutes, subject to the conditions in article 10 below.


14. Force Majeure



- 2.10. Access and usage of knowledge resource centre, infrastructural facilities such as convention centre at special 'Academic Associates' discounted charges.
- 2.11. The facilities for students and faculties at concessional charges.
- 2.12. Consultation, unbiased evolution of various educational processes as RFR Foundation Academic & Administrative Audit program.
- 2.13. Information and invitation for research events conducted by other associate members for associates' network.

ARTICLE 3: CO-ORDINATION AND NODAL OFFICER

"Confidential Information" means the confidential, proprietary, and trade secret information of the disclosing party to be disclosed by the disclosing party under this MOU, and comprises (a) information in tangible form that: (a) (1) bears a Confidentiality Legend, or (2) does not bear any Confidentiality Legend, if the receiving party knew, or reasonably should have known under the circumstances, that the information was confidential and had been communicated to it in confidence, and (b) discussions about that information that may occur before, at the same time, or after disclosure of the information. This MOU and all confidential information exchanged between the Parties pursuant to this MOU shall be held in confidence.

6.5.2. Neither Party nor any of the affiliates shall make any public announcement about the MOU and /or the scope of proposed engagement, without the prior written consent of the other Party. Any public announcement so made, shall be as outlined in the Article 2 of this MOU.

6.6 License and Intellectual Property Rights

6.6.1. No license is granted under this MOU to either Party under any of the other Party's intellectual property rights, either expressly, by implication, inducement, estoppel or otherwise. Both Parties understand and acknowledge that grant of any such license shall always be express and in writing.

6.6.2. Both parties will take all necessary steps to protect the knowledge documents and intellectual Properties generated during the process or shared by the parties.

6.7. Conflict of Interest

Neither of the parties believes that the Collaboration contemplated by this MOU raise any actual or potential conflicts of interest. The parties agree that this MOU and the negotiation of the same (and any other agreements entered into in connection herewith) are independent of any past, present or potential future arrangements, and are not connected to an existing business relationship between either of the parties.

ARTICLE 7: TERMINATION

7.1 This MOU shall also terminate without liability to either party if otherwise agreed to by the Parties in writing with a notice period of 1 month.

7.2 Survival and binding Nature

7.2.1. Except for Clause 6 (Terms), Clause 7 (Termination) and 8 (Dispute Settlement) of this MOU, nothing contained in this MOU is intended to be or shall be construed in any way to be legally binding on any of the Parties.

7.2.2. Except as set forth elsewhere in this MOU, Clause 6 (Terms), Clause 7 (Termination), 8 (Dispute Settlement) shall survive the expiry or termination of this MOU.

ARTICLE 8: DISPUTE SETTLEMENT

8.1 Governing Law and Jurisdiction

8.1.1. This MOU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of Republic of Bharat. All disputes arising out of or related to this MOU, including without limitation all matters connected with its performance, will be governed by, and construed and interpreted under the laws of Bharat, without reference to conflict of laws principles.

8.1.2. All disputes and differences arising out of or in connection with this MOU shall be the first instance referred to arbitration by three (3) arbitrators, jointly appointed by Parties. The decision and award determined by such arbitration will be final and binding upon the Parties. The arbitration will be conducted in accordance with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, as may be in force from time to time. The arbitration proceedings will be conducted in Hindi, English or any Bharatiya Language and the seat of arbitration will be New Delhi.

AND

GURU GHASIDAS VISHWAVIDYALAYA, BILASPUR (CG) India hereinafter called ("GGV"), a Central University of India, located in Bilaspur C.G. State, established under Central Universities Act 2009, No. 25 of 2009. Formerly called Guru Ghasidas University (GGU), established by an Act of the State Legislative Assembly, was formally inaugurated on June 16, 1983.

GGU is an active member of the Association of Indian Universities and Association of Commonwealth Universities. Situated in a socially and economically challenged area, the university is appropriately named to honor the great Satnami Saint Guru Ghasidas (born in 17th century), who championed the cause of the downtrodden and waged a relentless struggle against all forms of social evils and injustice prevailing in the society.

The University is a residential cum affiliating institution, having its jurisdiction spread over Bilaspur Revenue Division of the state of Chhattisgarh.

WHEREAS

- a) UTAR is a university offering courses in undergraduate and postgraduate programmes in the areas including Accountancy, Actuarial Science, Applied Mathematics, Arts and Social Science, Chinese Studies, Malaysian Studies,

- b) GGV offers courses in undergraduate and postgraduate programmes in the areas included under eleven schools of studies viz. Arts, Mathematical and Computational Science, Physical Sciences, Life Sciences, Natural Sciences, Engineering and Technology, Social Sciences, Law, Management and Commerce, Education, Interdisciplinary Education and Research. GGV also engages in the provision and conduct of research, consultation, management and leadership training and other related educational services at its campus at Koni, Bilaspur (CG) India only.
- c) Both parties now wish to enter into a series of discussions for meaningful collaboration for purposes more particularly set forth herein.

Following the discussions between UTAR and GGV (hereinafter called "the Parties"), the Parties hereby agree to the following.

1. AREAS OF UNDERSTANDING

- 1.1 The relationship created by this MOU is not intended to be binding in any court of law. Any collaborative ventures that may bind the Parties are subject to separate contractual arrangements which include terms relating to ownership, intellectual property, financial arrangements, use of resources, etc.
- 1.2 This MOU is intended to establish a basis upon which UTAR and GGV may explore areas for cooperation. In this regard, the Parties agreed to the following goals and objectives as part of their international collaboration programmes:

- a. To initiate joint projects involving international collaborative research and to share expertise and joint development of research.
- b. To facilitate academic development exchanges between the Parties, including mutual visits by faculty members to pursue research, teaching, and to participate in seminars, conferences, workshops, etc.
- c. To facilitate study visits and student exchange by postgraduate and undergraduate students where appropriate for the purpose of enhancing students learning experience.
- d. To facilitate internship by undergraduate students where appropriate.



2. DURATION

This MOU shall come into effect upon execution hereof by the Parties hereto and shall continue for a period of three (3) years and may be extended upon mutual agreement thereafter.

3. IMPLEMENTATION & COORDINATION

3.1 The implementation of the cooperation under this MOU shall be dealt with by the relevant departments or faculties of both Parties. A separate written agreement shall be entered into by the Parties setting out the detailed arrangements for collaboration which will stipulate the following:

- a. The scope, timeframe, and objectives of the activity in detail.
- b. The responsible persons within the particular departments or units that are concluding the agreement. The persons named will be directly responsible for the implementation and oversight of the proposed activity. Changes to the personnel



involved may be made at the discretion of the department or unit head, in coordination with the institutional points of contact at UTAR and GGV named in Clause 3.2 of this MOU; and

- c. The commitment of resources, if applicable, and the attendant financial obligations of the respective partnering departments. This MOU does not require either Party to support any new financial commitment unless expressly agreed otherwise by the partnering departments or units.

3.2 In order to oversee this MOU and coordinate with the associated departments and separate supplementary agreements, both the Parties agree that the institutional points of contact shall be the following:

4. AMENDMENT

The Parties may revise, amend or modify all or any part of this MOU by way of mutual consent in writing which shall come into force on such date to be determined by the Parties.

5. CONFIDENTIALITY

All information and/or data that may be exchanged, acquired and shared in connection with the areas of cooperation between the Parties pursuant to this



MOU shall be treated as strictly confidential and shall not under any circumstances be divulged by the receiving Party to any third party without the prior written consent of the disclosing Party unless otherwise the same has already been in the public domain. *Each of the party shall be liable to the other for any damages whatsoever as per the existing and effective rules of the respective institution.*

6. RESULTS OF COLLABORATION

Ownership of any research findings, curriculum, content and intellectual property arising from collaborative studies or researches shall be decided upon through mutual agreement of the Parties. Any publication, application, use and others regarding the same shall only be allowed after obtaining the prior written consent of both the Parties.

7. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

In no event shall either Party be liable to the other for any damages whatsoever including without limitation, direct, indirect, speculative, incidental, special, or consequential damages in connection with the performance under this MOU.

8. GOOD FAITH

In entering into this MOU, the Parties recognise that it is impractical to make provisions for every contingency that may arise in the course of the performances thereof. Accordingly, the Parties hereby declare it to be their intention that this MOU shall operate between them in accordance with the principles of good faith, with fairness and without detriment to the interests of any of the Parties. If in the course of this MOU, unfairness to any Party is disclosed or anticipated or any dispute arises, the Parties shall use their best endeavours to agree upon such action as may be necessary and equitable to remove or resolve the cause(s) of the same. If the Parties hereto fail to resolve

the disputes or disagreements amicably then the MOU shall be deemed to be terminated forthwith.

9. COSTS

No Party shall incur any expenditure on behalf of the other Party. Each Party shall be responsible for its own expenses incurred unless otherwise agreed upon prior to carrying out the activities under this MOU.

10. TERMINATION

Either Party may terminate this MOU for any reason whatsoever by giving to the other Party a written notice of three (3) months. Where such termination occurs, the provisions of this MOU shall continue to apply to on-going programmes or activities until their completion.

11. NOTICE

Any notice required to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be delivered by courier service or facsimile to the address stated herein.




