
VISION AND OBJECTIVES

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya is named after Saint Guru Ghasidas (1756-1836), a visionary social reformer. Guru Ghasidas founded Satnam Panthe, a socio-religious sect, which challenged contemporary discriminatory social order and advocated for social equality by refuting the exploitative and hierarchical caste system. With his holistic vision and systematic reforms. Guru Ghasidas contributed significantly in removing the prevailing social injustice and inequality.

Satnam Panth believes thaqt truth is God and there is only one God, which is formless (nirun) and infinite (anant). Individual reformation was brought by prohibiting consumption of liquor and non-vegetarian food. Guru Ghasidas also formulated principles which show his love for fauna and his desire to put an end to cruelty towards animals. The partisans of Satnam Panth have been following these dictates from last hundreds of years now.

After its up gradation into a central university, many steps have been taken by the University authorities to translate Guruji's philosphy into reality. Now, our campus is an alcohol and tobacco free campus. Our vibrant university campus, where students from diverse castes, creeds and classes come together from all over India, provides an egalitarian environment based on Guruji's teachings



CONVOCATION

The Seventh Convocation of Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, Bilaspur C.G. was held on November 16, 2018. Prof. D.P. Singh, Chairman, University Grants Commission, New Delhi, graced the ceremony as the Chief Guest. Special Guest of Honour Prof. N.C. Gautam, Vice-Chancellor, Mahatma Gandhi Chitrakoot Gramodaya Vishwavidyalaya, Chitrakoot (M.P.) Prof. Ashok Gajanan Modak, Chancellor, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, Bilaspur (C.G) presided over the Convocation, and Prof. Anjila Gupta, Vice-Chancellor presented the Annual Report.

At the outset, Vice-Chancellor welcomed all Hon'ble guests seated on the dais. The Chancellor presented the word of exhortation to all gradaunds before the conferment of the Degrees/Diplomas.

In the Convocation Degrees/Diplomas of successful and eligible graduates of last two years i.e. 2017 & 2018 were conferred, 61 Ph.D Scholars were awarded with the Degrees. A total of 2182 Degrees/Diplomas were conferred for the year 2017 and also 2146 for the year 2018 in-absentia. Total 136 students who secured first position in order of Merit from Nine Schools of Studies were also awarded with University as well as Donors Medals in the Convocation.

The Vice-Chancellor presented the Annual Report of 2017-2018. Prof. D.P. Singh the Hon'ble Chief guest delivered the Convocation Address. Prof. Ashok Gajanan Modak, Chancellor, GGV, delivered the Presidential Address. Prof. N.C. Gautam, Vice-Chancellor, Mahatma Gandhi Chitrakoot Vishwavidyalaya, Chitrakoot, (M.P.) also addressed on this occasion.

On this auspicious occasion, the Vice-Chancellor, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, Bilaspur (C.G.), members of the Executive Council, Academic Council, Deans, Schools of Studies, dignitries, HoDs, Officers, Employees, Ph.D. degree Holders, Gold Medallists, Students and their parents in large number were present.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE

"INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON EMERGING RESEARCHES IN BIOSCIENCE" (ICERB-2018) was organized by the Department of Zoology, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya from 28 October to 30 October, 2018. This conference was an excellent combination of keynote addresses, workshops, felicitation of eminent personalities and satellite symposiums of scientists from India and Abroad. A great deal of emphasis was laid on translational research so that clinicians and basic researchers could establish a dialogue and a new era of research from bench to bedside could be materialized.

Inaugural function and formal opening of the conference took place at the Rajat Jayanti Auditorium at 10:00 AM on 28th Oct, 2018. Chief Guest of the function was Prof. Shiv Prasad Kosta, former director of ISRO and presently Director of Shri Ram group of Institutions.

The event was presided over by Prof. Anjila Gupta, the Vice Chancellor, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, and other eminent personalities. Two International stalwarts in the field of biology, Prof. Frederick Williams, University of Toledo, Ohio, USA and Prof. Sohan Jheeta, University of Malawi and Director at LUCA, UK and two National Scientists Prof. Vibhuti Rai, Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur (CG) and Prof. Akhilesh Pandey, Director, MP State Private University Board were felicitated as the guest of honours during the inaugural function. This conference comprised of six main themes,

- Astrobiology and Medicine
- Biomedical and Pharmaceutical Research
- Environmental Toxicology and Occupational Health
- Biotechnology, Microbiology and Nanotechnology
- Neuroscience, Endocrinology and Metabolism.
- Biodiversity and Conservation

For each of these six themes. Special Keynote addresses were arranged which were followed by invited lectures and Young Scientists award presentations both in oral and poster categories. Purpose of the awards was to encourage active participation of young researchers in academics and research. About 312 presentations that included Keynote addresses, invited lectures, general oral presentations and young investigator award lectures and poster presentations were main attraction of the conference. In order to conduct the program smoothly, four parallel sessions were organized at the venues that were closely located. In order to encourage research collaboration between academicians and clinicians a dialogue between medical doctors and basic researchers was initiated at the meeting and several renowned national and international medical doctors participated in the interaction on 28th and 29th October, 2018. Idea of initiating the dialogue between academicians and clinicians was to promote transnational researches. Apart from regular technical programs mentioned above, three independent workshops were also organized during the conference on 'Wildlife Photography, Dope Testing and Alternatives to the use of animals in Life Sciences.

Several participants from abroad, who intended to participate in the meeting but due to problems in coming from distance places, participated by means of satellite symposia. 10 lectures of eminent biological scientists from abroad were organized through the satellite symposium and participants of the meeting had good interaction with the presenters.

In order to get some relaxing moments amidst the continuous scientific technical sessions, a 'Cultural Evening' was organized on 29th October, 2018. The main attraction of the event was invited cultural presentation by two exceptionally talented groups performing *Pandwan*i and *Gendi* dance forms that are cultural heritage of the State of Chhattisgarh. University Band 'Tarang' and students from School of Studies in Life Science actively participated in the cultural program which was hugely appreciated by the delegates.

Valedictory function of the conference was presided over by Prof. Anjila Gupta, the Vice Chancellor, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya and Chief Guest of the function was Dr. Rajni Sarin, a Medical Doctor, Eminent Social Worker and Director, Satlaj Jal Vidyut Board, GOI. Eminent Scientists like Prof. Sohan Jheeta, Director, LUCA, UK; Prof. K. K. Sharma, Former Vice Chancellor, MD University, Ajmer and Prof. M.A. Akbarsha, Director, Mahatma Gandhi Doerenkamp Center presented their views about the Conference. Certificates and Souvenirs were presented to the young scientists by the chief guest of the function. The Conference concluded with the Vote of thanks by the convener, Dr. Rohit Seth, followed by the National Anthem.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 UNIVERSITY AT A GLANCE

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, established as the state University in 1983, is a residential University, named after Guru Ghasidas, an eighteenth century Satnami saint. The University was upgraded to a Central University under the Central Universities Act, 2009 during the XI Five Year Plan. The University is an active member of the Association of Indian Universities and Association of Commonwealth Universities. National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) has accredited the University with a B status.

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya is located on the outskirts of the city of Bilaspur, popularly known as Nyayadhani (the city of Justice) and Sanaskardhani (the city of culture). Bilaspur is a cosmopolitan city, which houses High Court of Chhattisgarh, the headquarters of South East Central Railways and South Eastern Coalfields Limited. The journey of the University began in a humble way with a few departments in temporary buildings in Bilaspur city. Subsequently, it was shifted to the old army barracks of Second World War in the Koni area, located on the left bank of the river Arpa. The University campus is spread over 656 acres of land. Nature has bestowed the campus with unmatchable beauty, immaculate blend of green areas and water bodies.

The University offers opportunities to young minds and facilitates the accomplishment of their creative talent with emphasis on character building through various streams of knowledge. The University comprises of 32 University Teaching Departments under 09 Schools of Studies. It offers number of Undergraduate, Postgraduate and Ph.D. programs, besides diploma and postgraduate diploma courses. Admissions to all the programs are made through a competitive All India Vishwavidyalaya Entrance Test conducted by the University. Admissions to the professional courses are done as per the procedure laid down by respective professional bodies like admission in Institute of Technology (IT) and Department of Management Studies are made through All India Engineering Entrance Examination (AIEEE) and Management Aptitude Test (MAT), respectively. During 2018-19 academic sessions, 7131 students in the teaching departments of the University have been enrolled.

Chhattisgarh, formerly a backward region, is one of the fastest growing states in the country. As an industrial hub, the state requires sizeable pool of skilled manpower. The denizens of this area can tap these opportunities in a better manner by attaining quality education and training. The University has taken extensive steps to transform both teaching and learning process in order to meet contemporary global standards. To boost the quality of teaching, the University has appointed nationally and globally trained faculty members. The University is also committed to meet an ideal student-teacher ratio. The classrooms are being modernised by installing facilities like LCD projectors, quality furniture and air conditioners. Students are continuously evaluated through internal assessment, assignments and end semester examinations. The transparent evaluation process, where answer-sheets of the internal assessments as well as semester examinations answers sheets after evaluation are shown in the classrooms, helps the students



improve their performance. To maximize student's potential, the University has arranged excellent support facilities including hostels, cafeteria, gymnasium, student amenities centre and Wi-Fi connectivity. Through various classesremedial, spoken English, personality development and free coaching for competitive examinationsthe University is committed to guard equal opportunities for students belonging to traditionally marginalised Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

Special measures have been taken to provide an environment conducive for over all personality development of students. To keep pace with global environment of ICTs integrated teaching learning, 03 smart classrooms have been constructed and fully functional and more than 30 semi smart class rooms are under construction. The Central Library has printed books of 163308 (One Lac Sixty Three Thousand Three Hundred Eight) and subscribes number of national and international journals. Apart from the Central Library, most of the departments have their own departmental libraries. Excellent sports facilities are available in the campus and hostels. The University has planned to extend sport facilities by constructing a new gymnasium. Throughout the year, many activities are organised including Republic Day, Independence Day, Foundation Day, Education Day, Swami Vivekanand Jayanti, Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel Jayanti, Teachers Day, Mahatma Gandhi Jayanti, Guru Ghasidas Jayanti to make the campus vibrant. Along with sports and cultural activities, students are also encouraged to participate in social outreach initiative of the University. Through these activities, students are encultured in participatory ways of life. International and national level events are organised to expose students to new ideas of eminent persons from all walks of life. The University teaching departments organise fieldwork, industrial visits and educational tours to impart practical knowledge. To inculcate leadership qualities among students, the University has successfully constituted the students' council. The students' council represents all the students of the University.

To face challenges posed by the process of development, the University community is all set to contribute to the larger society through quality research and development in the various areas including energy security, food security, biodiversity management, pollution management, forest management and developmental policy. The UGC Human Resource Development Centre College regularly organises orientation and refresher courses, short term Courses & Workshop for the capacity building of teachers and staff. During these courses, expertise of senior faculty members of the University and practitioners from diverse fields is utilised.

GGV has signed Tri-partite Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) and University Grants Commission (UGC) where in data of all Academic, Administrative, Financial, etc. activities have been sent from time to time in the prescribed format.

In the coming years, the University aims to act as a role model for the Central Universities and simultaneously provide an educational opportunity to the growing number of the students of the region. The University is on the path of realising twin goals envisioned by the National Knowledge Commission; "of making higher education more relevant to the needs and opportunities of a knowledge society" and "to make higher education more accessible to all sections of the society."

2. ACADEMIC ORGANS 2.1 SCHOOLS OF STUDIES

The University offers various programs through 32 Departments under 9 different Schools of Studies. The present set-up of School of Studies and Departments is as follows:

2.1.1 ARTS

The five departments under the School of Arts are English, Hindi, Journalism & Mass Communication, Library & Information Science, and Physical Education. The departments under the School cover a wide range of courses and research interests.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH & FOREIGN LANGUAGES

Established in 1990, the Department of English and Foreign Languages has been endeavouring to provide the students a firm grounding in English studies in a very congenial atmosphere of teaching and learning.

The interest in literary studies can be seen in the growing number of undergraduate students who opt for English as their honours or elective subject. Students aspiring to obtain a post graduate degree in Literature in English get introduced to all the important aspects of literatures written in English. We are also aware of the importance of research. Accordingly, our syllabi incorporate the latest aspects of literary studies



and research so as to prepare the students well for research and teaching. The Department is also a recognized research centre with all facilities.

A stimulating ambience in the Department, regular seminars, assignments and special invited lectures on specific portions of syllabus enhance the purpose of imparting quality education. 

The departments under the School cover a wide range of practical courses and research interests.

DEPARTMENT OF ANTHROPOLOGY AND TRIBAL DEVELOPMENT

The Department of Anthropology was established in the year 1989. It is one of the oldest departments of the University. The department plays a vital role as Chhattisgarh harbours a substantial tribal population with diverse cultures. Anthropology, as a science of people, has a strong potential to work for the welfare and all-round development of the weaker sections of the society of the State as well as of the country. The department is providing BA/B.Sc & MA/M.Sc. degree in Anthropology under CBCS, BA/B.Sc Integrated five years degree course, Ph.D programme.

The main objectives of the department are to generate qualified, skilled and committed anthropologists; to play a catalytic role as social advisers to policy makers in matters relating to tribal development, empowerment and tribal health; to study and suggests remedial measures with respect to eradication of hunger and malnutrition; and to reduce mortality and morbidity incidences among tribal and non-tribal population of Chhattisgarh. The department also aims at creating awareness among tribal population of Chhattisgarh with respect to their rights enshrined in the Constitution of India.

The department has a cultural and archaeological museum. The course contents also deal with issues and concerns covering different dimensions of human rights and development. Departmental field work is conducted on the tribal's inhabiting remote areas. Department also completed a number of research projects on topics like Rehabilitation and Displacement, Nutritional Status of the Hill Korwas, Tribal Indebtedness, Monograph and Village Studies. The department works in close collaboration with the local NGOs for productive research and development. The department has maintained a library consisting of more than 900 books. With up-gradation of laboratory infrastructure, the department has revised the syllabus taking into account the national requirements of the students.

The Department has come into existence in 2009 for imparting undergraduate, post-graduate education and for promoting research. The department has grown into a well-recognized Centre for higher learning and research in Plant Sciences. Botany department has the necessary expertise to attend all the aspects of plants. The department offers 3 years UG, 2 year PG degree course and Ph. D. Programme in Botany. The department has a well-stacked library with more than 3000 books and over 150 online scientific journals, which caters to the research needs of the faculty and the students. The original aim of providing quality education to the educationally underprivileged tribal state Chhattisgarh has been successfully fulfilled by the Department. The department has been operating several research projects funded by various National and International agencies. The faculty of the department has produced quality research publications in reputed national and international journals. We have over 300 research publications viz.

Microbiology; Environmental Microbiology, Mycology, biotechnology; environmental management, restoration & biodiversity conservation; ecology; ethnobotany; bionanotechnology; cell and molecular biology; bacteriology etc. The research activities of the department are spread over 5 laboratories; each faculty supervising one laboratory. 20 doctoral students and various project fellows constitute the core group working in these laboratories.



Infrastructure

The departmental laboratories are equipped with the advanced instrumentation facilities like Gas Chromatograph, Photo-microscopy with Leica (DM200) Microscopes, PCR thermo cycler,



Kjeldhal, Phytotron etc. Moreover, the department also extends facilities of RT-PCR, Chemi-Doc XRS, HPLC, LC-MS/MS and Atomic Absorption Spectrophotometer. We have been recently able to establish a plant tissue culture, plant cell & molecular biology lab and a bioinformatics lab with computers connected to broadband internet facility. The Department is planning to establish a Botanical Garden spreading over 20 acres and a Nursery in 2 acres located within the campus of the University.

The Garden shall house rare, threatened, endemic and medicinal plants of Chhattisgarh to provide excellent opportunity for the postgraduate students and research scholars for experimental purposes.

The Department of Forestry, Wildlife & Environmental Sciences, is a premier institution in the state imparting forestry education since 1988-89. It has also taken the lead role in forestry education and research in Central India. The department has been following the modern syllabus developed by ICFRE/ICAR for BSc and MSc Programmes. The syllabus is focused to develop integrated knowledge and skills relevant to forestry and



integrated knowledge and skills relevant to forestry and allied subjects and is also designed to prepare them for various competitive exams such as IFS, SFS, ARS etc. Our vision is "to promote excellence in education, research and extension in forestry and allied subjects to cater the need of trained man power for practicing sustainable forestry and its protection and conservation in the region and country". The



department has number of renowned faculties awarded with research projects and delivers invited lectures in various events in different institutes and departments. Trainings of the students in rural and forest villages, forest industries, academic and research institutes are an integral part of the curriculum. It is intended to develop practical knowledge, expose to industrial and research environment and to promote entrepreneurship skills among the students. UG and PG students are also required to have compulsory attachment to the State Forest department, biosphere reserves, national parks, wildlife sanctuaries etc for the exposure of forestry work operation.

Objective

- To promote excellence in education and research in Forestry and allied subjects.
- To provide the students with innovative knowledge and skills and cater the need for trained forestry man power in the country.

Scop

- Curriculum of the degree programme is designed to impart essential scientific / technical
 and administrative competence to the forestry science graduates so that they are ideally
 suited for the positions of Range Forest Officer (RFO) and Assistant Conservator of
 Forest (ACF).
- The graduates have a wide scope of job opportunities like nursery and plantation managers, technical assistants and managers in forest based industries like pulp and paper industries, small scale and cottage industries etc. The students pursuing M.Sc. and Ph.D. (Forestry) can be scientist or Assistant Professor after qualifying competitive exams and National Eligibility Test.

Presently the department runs in well-spaced building with laboratories located behind luxurious

plantation of *Peltaphorum*. One new building is added to the department with Classrooms, faculty rooms, workshop, museum and advance research laboratories.



Department is having well equipped under graduate and post graduate laboratories for general physics, mechanics, heat and thermodynamics, optics, electronics, and computational techniques. Advanced material characterization facilities such as, Scanning Electron Microscopy, Atomic Force Microscopy, Fourier Transform Infrared Spectroscopy, UV-Vis Spectrophotometer and X - Ray Diffractometer are available for the M. Sc. students & research scholars of the department as a central facility.



Departmental library provides rich resources for both students and researchers. Department is striving very hard to improve the quality of Physics education to stand as one of the leading science education centers in the country. We express our deep desire to work with the new students to make their lives brighter. The department is having its own training and placement cell, which trains students for national level entrance examinations, looks after their placement at various research institutes and industry. Students from the department are encouraged to appear



in national level examinations like, NET, GATE, JEST etc. The department is having dynamic academic activity by coordinating regular seminars of eminent science personalities, workshops, and symposia.

Department has taken a bold initiative to establish a 3 MV high current pelletron accelerator facility. The facility is supported by Department of Atomic Energy, Govt. of India through BRNS as a National Centre for Accelerator Based Research and by UGC as a special grant for

establishing the center. This facility has strengthen the research support in the region boldly poised us on the International map of science & technology as one of the emerging research institution. The facility is providing opportunities to carry out interdisciplinary research work in various branches of science & technology.

Department has prepared its short-term, mid-term and long term vision in term of quality improvement in teaching, creating research ambiance and providing skill enhancement to the students. We have introduced CBCS system at undergraduate level and have designed six skill based program viz. workshops skill in physics and electronics, electrical circuit analysis, radiation safety, and renewable energy. These courses will be offered from this session. We are also constantly attempting to improve the



quality of teaching in the courses being offered and have included several ICT tool as a mode of

delivery and reoriented our curriculum as learner centric. In order to provide the industrial exposure and peer interaction, we have introduced internship programs in undergraduate courses. In the research front our aim is to establish state of the art synthesis and measurement facilities for developing thin film, nanomaterials, and mesoscopic materials. Our immediate plan is to start electrical, magnetic and thermal measurement.



Two M. Tech. level courses in Nuclear Technology and Nano-science and Technology will be started in near future. In addition, considering the societal needs and capabilities available in the department, we are planning to start the short term certificate courses in the areas of radiation safety measurement, instrumentation and simulation that will be helpful for skill enhancement and capacity building of our student.

With the young and dynamic faculty having vide international exposure in the niche areas of the research our research plans reflects towards contributing effectively for the make-in India and start-up India program in the field of materials development for high-end scienceand technology areas.

2.2 INFORMATION COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY AND COMPUTATIONAL FACILITIES (COMPUTER CENTRE)/IUMS

The University has established an advanced Computer Centre equipped with the latest versions of hardware, machines and software such as Desktop (50-Dual Core and i5), Laser Printer B/W (04), Scanners (04), Hub & Switches, LCD Projectors, Visual Studio 2008, Ms Office 2007, SQL Server 2005, Win Server ENT 2003, Win Server 2003 R2,Office Pro 2003, Media. The department of CSIT of this University is fully utilizing the services of Computer Center as their only laboratory. Computer Center provides Computing Facility to MCA, M.Sc. (CS) and 5-Year UG/PG Integrated B.Sc. (Computer Science) Students for their practical. The Computer Center also offers its services to students of other departments such as Physical Education, Pharmacy etc. particularly UG-PG Integrated students of other departments. The Computer Centre provides central computational facilities to assist teaching, research, administration, examination, finance and other important tasks of the University. The Computer Centre provides facility to arrange presentation, Lectures, Seminars/Conference, MCA/MSc. Project/Ph.D. Presentation with LCD projector from time to time. At present 50 nodes are connected on the network and internet facility and Wi-Fi facility is being provided to students, faculty, staff and research scholars.

Website Maintenance

The Computer Centre maintains the official Website of the University (www.ggu.ac.in) which was hosted in 2005. The Website now contains more than 600 pages. Website of Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya is in Bilingual form (Hindi/English). The Center updates the information received from various departments/Sections of University at the earliest time. "Employee Search" facility is

also available in our website for University Employees. The Official Website of Vishwavidyalaya is hosted on NIC server. The website is updated regularly with all information related to Admission, Tender, Time Table, Examination, Recruitment, Photo Gallery, Students Activities etc. Our website follows almost all the norms of Guidelines for Indian Government Websites (GIGW).

Arranging live telecast of events broadcast from Government of India

From time to time, national level webcast programmes are conducted and the IT Cell arranges to telecast those programmes to all students and staff at its campus. The video conferencing and other interactive events released by the Ministry of HRD, and others are also conducted where University's authorities participated in the events. Digital and Cashless Transaction

In order to move towards the national mission of Digital India, along with other activities as mentioned here, the University also initiated to receive all payments online or through swipe machines. The admission, semester and all types of fees from students are successfully collected digitally using various banks or IUMS services available in the University.

Internet facilities in the GGV Campus

Internet facility is provided through NMEICT (National Mission on Education through Information & Communication Technology) / NKN (National Knowledge Network) Project in GGV campus since October 2012. Industry standard Copper and Optic Fiber cabling & Network products of a proper LAN infrastructure (within 20-25 k.m distance) consist of Router, Switches, Firewall, Access Points that covers all buildings with 460 node points in core locations along with large number of nodes (more than 3000) inside and outside of the various buildings and available for 24x7 internet facilities to all. The Campus LAN is based on the layered approach which provides scalable Network with minimum downtime which is maintainable by NKN and FMC by BSNL.

The University has launched free Wi-Fi facility in the campus under the Campus-Connect project of Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India in the year 2017. The University campus is now Wi-Fi campus covering both academic and hostel, guest house buildings of the campus. The Wi-Fi services are used to provide 24x7 internet facilities to students, officers, teachers and staff members. This project is implemented in two phases. In first phase National Informatics Centre Services Incorporated (NICSI) had taken care of passive work of the project through Wipro and in the second phase RailTel Corporation of India Ltd.is taking care of active part of the Wi-Fi services in the Campus. More than 250 access points have been installed in the different buildings of university.

Integrated University Management System (IUMS)

- RTI Modules tracks and processes all RTI related applications and keeps records of such applications including the action taken on each one.
- Legal Module Provides online access to all legal cases and the status of each case related to the University.
- Hostel Module takes care of student hostel allotment related work like availability, allotment, fee, student
- Court Cases Monitoring System (Legal) provides all legal cases history record management and related MIS
- Asset / Bill Management provide facilities to store and finance section to bill payment related work and related MIS.
- Inventory provides facilities to store section related work.
- Portal as per notification all admission related information like broacher, notification, advertisement, details of seats, policy, new student registration, on line form submission with on line payment facility, course wise roll number generation, all type of related report information are available.

2.3 HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

UGC-Academic Staff College is renamed as UGC-Human Resource Development Centre (HRDC) in 2015 and Implementable from 01 February, 2015. UGC-Academic Staff College (ASC) was established on the lush green campus on 27th March, 2009 in order to provide in-service training programmes for the faculty in various disciplines and plays a crucial role in the holistic development of teachers. The training programmes viz., Orientation programme, Refresher Courses, Short Term Courses, Interaction Programmes, Workshops, Seminars are regularly

organized as per the guidelines of UGC, New Delhi. HRDC has excellent Class rooms with Audi-Visual, Internet and Multimedia facilities; create an conductive environment for interactive learning. State of the Art Information Communication Technology (ICT) Laboratory with high speed internet facilities further provide opportunities for participants to learn the soft skills by hands on training from time to time during programmes. HRDC has its own library with 533 numbers of book and digital resources to meet the needs of resource persons and participants. The Central library of the University also extends facilities of INFLIBNET, Science Direct, e-resources, books and journals to HRDC. We are having good facilities of guest house, medical and transport. Eminent academicians and researchers are invited as resource person for delivering lectures in the training programmes in addition to the senior faculty of the Vishwavidyalaya. The highly motivated faculty, state of the art facilities, excellent logistics and ambience are the strengths of our HRDC and key to the successful organisation of quality programmes.

VISION

The HRDC envisages to propagate the values of quality education and train the teachers to become intellectually enlightened, morally upright, emotionally balanced, socially committed, patriotic, eco-friendly and accomplished, and sensitive to the demands and the needs of the students in their journey towards achieving the goals and objectives of higher education.

- To develop and maintain online interactive connectivity for functional operations with all the HRDCs in the concerned region, and facilitate e-content delivery, using National Mission of Education through ICT (NMEICT) resources, adoption of emerging technologies and Massive Open Online.

- To develop a multimedia repository of some of the best content delivered in the Region or other Regions through collaboration for mutual sharing.
- To set up a regional documentation-IT enabled centre-cum-library for reference and source materials necessary for the programmes.
- To communicate and manage display of advisories to the participants in advance giving the theme, focus and other details about the programmes.
- To maintain an information portal giving all details about programmes planned by the RCCB and HRDCs in the specified region with names and brief CVs of resource persons and preferably full text or at least PPTs with abstract and references of the content proposed to be delivered.
- In collaboration with HRDCs in the specified region regular collection and analysis of

feedback from participants on programme delivered in the region, for consistent review for quality enhancement.

 To send every quarterly a detailed report about the programmes conducted, analysed feedback of participants etc. to the coordinator of PPMSC.

2.4 NATIONAL CENTRE FOR ACCELERATOR BASED RESEARCH, DEPARTMENT OF PURE & APPLIED PHYSICS

Guru Ghasidas University, after its up gradation as a Central University, has taken a bold step in establishing a 3.0 MV Pelletron based Accelerator machine in the Department of Pure & Applied Physics as an Accelerator based Interdisciplinary Research Centre on the initiative of the then Vice-chancellor. The basic objective of the Centre has been to boost the Research & Development in various areas of Science & Technology for further research in understanding mechanisms responsible for materials modification through ion beam interaction and other interdisciplinary areas and to bring the ion beam technology on the university campus so as to provide internationally competitive environment for research in the niche areas of science. This has been conceptualized and initiated as a flagship program of the university.

Notable achievements during the period are as given below

We have made consistent effort to comply with the requirements of Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB) for granting the permission to run the Accelerator in regular mode. However, so far the radiation monitors have been calibrated and installed as desired by AERB. We are currently focusing on the maintenance work to perform test experiments so as to submit the data desired by AERB. The SF6 gas has been procured and the maintenance of air circulation system is under progress. We shall be starting conditioning of the machine soon. However, no experiments were performed during the period due to non-receipt of AERB permission.

In another important development, Chairman UGC on the request of secretary DST has constituted a high power committee consisting of Prof. S.K. Joshi, Former Director General, CSIR, Secretary, DST, Govt. of India, Secretary, DAE, Govt. of India and Director, IUAC, New Delhi. The committee has reviewed the progress and considered the problems of Accelerator based Research Facilities established with the support from DST (under Mega Science Programme) and DAE in various Universities/Institutes to create an environment for pursuing experimental work in interdisciplinary areas and for training human resource. It provides an opportunity to younger generation to get involved in projects involving state-of-the-art technologies. The mini accelerator based research facility in University/Institute creates an environment for pursuing experimental work in interdisciplinary areas as accelerator based laboratory provides best possible environment for training human resource as it encompasses latest technologies such as computer control, analog and digital instrumentation, ultra-high vacuum, cryogenics etc.

The fisrt meeting of the committee was held in March, 2019 in IUAC, New Delhi which was attended by the Centre In charge Prof. P.K. Bajpai. Committee resolved that concerted efforts shall have to be made to nucleate cost intensive front ranking research base in Nano Science & Nano Technology, Bio Technology, Materials Science and Bioinformatics towards 'Smart Convergence' along with a roadmap for its sustenance. Committee shall submit its recommendations to UGC and through an MoU these centre may get financial support from UGC directly under the monitoring of IUAC.

Maintenance works completed successfully:

Annual maintenance performed (05/10/2018 to 15/10/2018) since Pelletron tank SF6 gas pressure was low (49PSI), SF6 gas transferred from 2 nos.SF6 gas cylinders to Pelletron tank through SF6 gas storage tank.

- CEL organized Special Lecture Series-II on 'Language and Culture of Tribal People of Arunachal Pradesh' by Dr. Joram Begi, as Chief Guest, Hon'ble Chief Information Commissioner, State Information Commission, Arunachal Pradesh, on 15.11.2019.
- Following all technical and administrative processes, GGV has signed the agreement on dt.18.01.2019 with ITI, New Delhi to establish one Archive Laboratory and Phonetic Laboratory to process the endangered languages/dialects as a part of the preservation and teaching to the students. ITI, New Delhi started his physical works for establishing the Archive Laboratory and Phonetic Laboratory of the Centre. The work is in progress.





5.3 FACILITIES FOR THE STUDENTS

5.3.1 Dean Students' Welfare

The Dean, Students' Welfare Section of Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, provides the required information to students and parents throughout the year through office, telephone and help line portals. 5.3.2. Proctorial Board


BOYS'HOSTELS

Swami Vivekanand Boys Hostel (SVBH)

Established in 1989, Swami Vivekanand Boys Hostel (SVBH) consists of 228 rooms with total

capacity of 475, two common halls and one recreation hall. The hostel provides accommodation to 322 students (Gen.-99, SC-50, ST-12, OBC-161 and PH- Gen-01, OBC-01). For the allotment of room, the hostel strictly follows reservation policy as per rule.

Two separate mess facilities were available for students. Facilities such as cycle stand, reading room, common-hall, recreational hall, and Sports facilities like Table Tennis, Carom Board, Badminton are available. Five Water Coolers each equipped with water filter devices are available at convenient locations.



NEW BOYS HOSTEL-'A'

This Hostel was established in July 2018 comprising one hundred rooms, one common room, dining hall, TV room, reading room, 40 toilets, water purifier and all necessary facilities. There are two residence guarter for hostel warden also available. In the session 2018-19 total 190 students were admitted in which 34 UR, 38 SC, 23 ST, 95 OBC and 2 minorities were accommodated.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

In the session, apart from sports and cultural program some other activities were also conducted by the residents. Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan was also conducted by the students with the help of NSS volunteers on 2ndFebruary 2019 on the hostel campus. On the same day Chief Warden distributed dustbin to every student to keep the surrounding clean and hygienic.

NEW BOYS HOSTEL-'B'

This Hostel was established in July 2018 for the new students with the capacity of 200 students, comprising one hundred rooms, one common room, dining hall, TV room, reading room, as many as 40 toilets, water purifier and all necessary facilities. Two residence quarters for hostel warden are also available. In the session 2018-19 total 164 students were admitted from various departments.

Cleaning Programe: Cleaning activities were organized by the hostel's students and NSS volunteer on 02/02/19. On this day, dustbins were distributed to all the students to maintain the cleanliness in room and hostel.

GIRLS' HOSTEL

The University girls' hostel was established in 1989 to provide accommodation to the girls students. Since then, the hostel facilities are improving every year. Our main aim is to provide calm, safe, educational and family atmosphere to hostellers so that they can fulfil their dreams for their bright future. Hostel provides accommodation to 436 girl students (maximum). In the academic session 2018-19, the category wise total numbers of girls accommodated in the hostel were Gen-116, OBC-134, SC-52, and ST-30 giving a total of 332 students in hostel.

EXISTING FACILITIES AND DEVELOPING FACILITIES

- Every year the existing facilities are upgraded in hostel as and when required.
- Cleanliness and other infrastructural maintenance like timely white wash, paintings are ensured.
- Along with facilities like mess, medical aids, proper security, TV rooms, Hindi and English news papers etc., hostel is also equipped with internet connection and wi fi facilities.
 - All wings of Hostel are facilitated with separate water cooler attached with water purifier for cold and purified water.
- We have provided induction heater in all wings for boiling and cooking the necessary food items to hostel inmates for 24 hours.
- Generator facility is also available in hostel.
- Beautiful garden and greenery inside the hostel adds to the aesthetic beauty of it.
- Facilities for outdoor and indoor games like badminton, table tennis, carom and chess are available in hostel.
- Two Chhattisgarh government home guard (lady) has been placed for day and night to take care of hostel inmates.
- Gardens are provided with swings and beautiful fixed chairs for the purpose of recreation to hostel inmates in their leisure time.
- For proper maintenance of sanitation and hygiene sanitary vending machine is purchased.

Extra-Curricular Activities

- Time to time several extracurricular activities have been organized in hostel for sociocultural exchange, recreation and overall holistic development of hostellers.
- 'Rangoli Competition' and Mehandi competition were organized.
- Eco-Day was organized in the girl's hostel to make younger generation more sensitive towards environmental protection.
- Induction Programme -Transition from school to university/college life is one of the most challenging events in a student's life. When new students enter an institution, they come with diverse thoughts, backgrounds and preparations. Many of them have little knowledge of a university/colleges. Induction programme was organized in the Girls hostel to educate the new entrants about the environment in the institution.

5.3.6 Central Placement Cell

Guru Ghasidas Viswavidyalaya's Central Placement Cell is not only focusing placement for professional courses such as Engineering, Management and Pharmacy but it is equally focused for other branches of science as well as humanities and commerce.

The Central Placement Cell (C.P.C) of Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya endeavors to facilitate and provide



suitable placement in reputed multinationals, government organization, NGO's and the private sector. All students of Vishwavidyalaya are entitled to placement assistance, need based training and counseling for employment. The cell assures support to the visiting companies at every stage of the placement process by making Vishwavidyalaya infrastructure available to them.

The Central Placement Cell of Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya has all required modern infrastructure facilities for receiving various companies in the campus and also for imparting training to the students. Namely it has an air conditioned Seminar Hall which can house about 200 persons as well as air conditioned Interview Rooms to add to the many facilities available in the Vishwavidyalaya such as conference room and a seminar hall with a capacity of 100. The Vishwavidyalaya is having centrally air cooled state of the art modern auditorium (Rajat Jayanti Shabhagar) having all ICT facilities which can house 800 persons

The CPC acts as an interface between the industry and the students and will primarily enable the students to select the best available for their career. It facilitates the selection process of all the companies as per their requirement. The CPC liaisons with corporate sectors, many organizations to provide suitable jobs for the candidates completing their study from the Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya. The CPC plans to conduct seminars and workshops to enable the students of Vishwavidyalaya to become successful professionals. The CPC aims to expose its students to such training which are related to latest technologies in different areas besides organizing the placement activities.

5.3.7 UDDAN: The Official Student Magazine

UDAAN is the official Student Magazine of the Vishwavidyalaya. Since its inception, it is growing and evolving. The magazine aims at churning out the latent talent of the students who bear immense potential. It not only showcases the creativity of our students but also the painstaking preparations that go into the making of *Udaan* sharpen the skills and contribute to their overall personality development. The activities related to Udaan provide a common space for students to meet and interact with each other.

Each edition of this magazine is a milestone that marks growth, unfolds the imagination, and gives life to thoughts and aspirations of students. It helps unleash a wide spectrum of creative and critical skills ranging from writing to editing and even designing the magazine. The contents of the magazine reflect the wonderful creativity of thoughts and imagination of our students.

There are as many as 07 Boards headed by a co-ordinator which undertakes a specific part of the magazine under broad supervision of 03 main Student Co-ordinators. Members to these boards are selected through a mass level audition which comprises of Individual Tasks, written Tests, and Personal Interview etc. Audition is conducted by the previous season team members and after selection of new members the new team starts working on the next volume. This particular feature contributes to the Healthy Practises of the university. Team UDAAN has also organised the first Art Exhibition of the University on the day of its launching. 5.3.8 TARANG

TARANG is the university's musical band which is a student-managed group. Like every year, around 30 students were recruited in the group in the session 2018-19, by a thorough selection process. The total strength of the singers and the instrumentalists is 45.

The Tarang takes the responsibility to present the Kulgeet and the Saraswati Vandana for the inaugural functions of the official events of the university. Apart from this, they also perform in the cultural evenings of such programmes.

6. COMMON FACILITIES

Since it's up-gradation to a Central University, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya has made a number of concerted efforts to develop new support services and strengthen the existing ones. A brief description is as follows.

6.1 ACCOMMODATION

Jawahar Atithi Griha

The Vishwavidyalaya Guest House, located amidst lush green surrounding and pollution free environment, has 16 well-furnished and air-conditioned rooms to provide comfortable stay to visitors to the Campus at a reasonable charge and 01 air conditioned conference hall for meetings. To serve delicious vegetarian food to the guests at reasonable charges, a well-equipped kitchen operates within the guest house premises. At present all the rooms are equipped with television with DTH system. Refrigerators have been installed in 08 rooms. Four VIP rooms have been equipped with direct dialing telephone facility.

Forestry Guest House

The Forestry Guest House was established with a grant-in-aid received from Indian Council for Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE), Dehradun. It has 31 rooms. The guest house is surrounded by different forest tree species. The guest house provides temporary accommodation to visiting teachers, research scholars and students. The guest house has well equipped modern Gymnasium. All the rooms are well furnished. Presently, the forestry guest house has been temporarily converted into a hostel to meet the increasing demand of accommodation for students.

New International Guest House

The International Guest House is constructed with a grant-in-aid from UGC XI plan. It is newly constructed building with G+ 2 floors. It has five VIP suites, 38 rooms, one party hall and Gymnasium. It is located at the elevated southern area of campus and surrounded by the lush green area.

Residential Facility for Employees

The University extends residential facility to its employees. Presently, there are 233 staff quarters for different categories of Teaching/Non-Teaching staff of the University. The staff colony is very well connected by roads with well-lit avenues. The colony is surrounded by lush green trees and has a pleasant environment. A 'Kali' temple built near the quarters provides a space for peaceful meditation and for occasional social celebrations. Residential facilities for Employees in the campus are as follows:

6.2 AUDITORIUM AND CONFERENCE HALLS

AUDITORIUM AND CONFERENCE HALLS

Rajat Jayanti Sabhagar (Silver Jubilee Auditorium):

To commemorate Silver Jubilee Year (2007) of the University, a centrally air-cooled auditorium with a seating capacity of about 800 persons was constructed. Apart from annual events, such as, Convocation ceremony, Guru Ghasidas Jayanti, Central University Foundation Day and Teachers Day, a number of cultural programmes, seminars, discussions and lectures are hosted in the auditorium.

Conference Hall (with Smart Class facilities):

Located in the administrative block of the university, the fully air-conditioned conference hall can accommodate up to 100 persons. The conference hall is a multipurpose venue for holding meetings, seminars, workshops, Ph.D. viva-voce and various co-curricular activities and is equipped with all the latest audio-visual facilities.

Mini Conference Hall: In addition to the main conference hall, an air-conditioned mini conference hall is located on upper floor in the administrative block of the university with a seating capacity of about 40 persons.

6.3 CENTRAL LIBRARY

The Central Library of the University was established on 26th October 1984 to meet the academic needs and information requirements of the students, teachers and research scholars. It is housed in a spacious building, having sitting capacity of more than 500 users. Its collection comprises of 163308 books, 5258 e-books, 4582 back volumes of Indian/Foreign scholarly journals and 1438 PhD theses. Library uses SOUL2.0 library management software for its in-house operations. The software is integrated with and RFID surveillance system. Free Internet and Wi-Fi facilities are available to the users inside the campus to access e-resources. Reprography, Current awareness services (CAS) and Selective dissemination of information (SDI) are also made available on demand.

6.4 CAFETERIA

New Cafeteria Building with G+1 floor is constructed with grant-in-aid from UGC XI plan. It is situated behind university auditorium. It has one big café-seating hall of $25m \times 16m$ at ground floor. There are five big halls on the first floor, the total build up area of the cafeteria is 1005 sq.m. The Cafeteria is successfully catering to the daily needs of the university community. The Cafeteria remains open on all working days from 8.00 a.m. to 7.00 p.m. On special occasions, the cafeteria opens on holidays too.

Devbhog-the up-front brand of Chhattisgarh State Cooperative Dairy Federation has opened a counter at adjoining part of the Cafeteria which provides quality milk and milk products at the reasonable prices to the students and staffs of the university.

6.5 CENTRAL SECURITY SECTION

The University is spread over more than 656 acres of land, which houses a number of buildings, laboratories, residential apartments, guest houses, hostels, forest lands with precious species of trees and water bodies. To maintain security of this widely spread campus and to creat an efficient and vigilant security system the university has created Central Security Section. The Central Security Section comprises of one in-charge, one security officer, two assistant security officers and five security supervisors. It works under the University administration and is responsible for

the security of the campus. For this the University campus is divided into four sections the North, the East, the West and the South. Every zone is looked after by Assistant Security Officer and Security Supervisors and the Assistant Security Officer inspect each zone time to time. The coordination between the University administration and contractual security agencies is also maintained by the Central Security Section. The duties of the Central Security Section also include: regulating traffic inside the University campus, systematizing parking facilities and assisting the Proctorial board in maintaining discipline in the campus.

6.6 HEALTH CENTRE

Health Centre is located at the Centre of the University Campus. Health Centre has Male Ward, Female Ward and a Pathological lab which cater to the needs of the students, residents of the campus and employees of the University. One Medical Officer with assisting staff compounder, ANM (Female) and Ambulance driver is posted at the centre. From time to time specialist doctor visits the Health Centre, at the same time patients requiring further treatment are referred to Medical College (CIMS) or Apollo Hospital. All the medical facilities, treatment and medicines to students, employees are provided free of cost. The Health Centre has an Electro Cardio Grapy (ECG) Machine and a Chemical Blood Analyzer for carrying out various blood tests. The Health Centre also provides twenty four hours ambulance services and doctors on call. The Centre also has limited in-patient facility.

6.7 INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

In order to monitor and improve everyday functioning of various departments of the University, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell has been established which was re-structured during the period. The cell is expected to enquire, suggest, and monitor the effective implementations of various initiatives towards improvement of the functioning of the University.

During the session 2018-19 apart from routine works, work for NIRF ranking and AQAR preparations for session 2018-19 was done. Feedback from different stackholders was also collected. At present works on SSR and IIQA is under process.

6.8 UNIVERSITY DIARY, WALL AND TABLE CALENDAR

After the upgradation of the university into a central university and after the joining of Prof. Anjila Gupta as the 2nd Vice Chancellor of the university, an initiative to publish a university diary, wall and table calendars was taken. Accordingly university diary is printed and published every year in which all important information pertaining to the university and the contact details of the Officers, Deans and Heads are given.

The university wall calendar is published each year in which apart from the information of dates, days and holidays certain themes is chosen to depict the rich cultural heritage, physiographic characters and demographic variations of Chhattisgarh state. For the year 2019, the theme was the folk dances of Chhattisgarh. Likewise, the Table calendar is designed to flash the various achievements and activities of the university. For the year 2019 different academic, co-academic and other activities on the programmes of the Government of India has been printed.

The university diary, wall calendar and table calendar are sent to the different departments of the Government of India, Government of Chhattisgarh, all the central universities and central institutes as well as the institutes of national importance for information.

6.9 GGV NEWSLETTER

The University publishes quarterly magazine GGV Newsletter which provides a glimpse of various major activities performed in the University, achievements of faculty and students, news form the Departments/Sections and one page "a special talk with the Dean of School" highlighting the achievements, challenges and future prospects of their School of Studies in every issue. The Editorial Board comprises of faculty members of Journalism & Mass Communication, English and Hindi and Prof. B.N. Tiwary, Professor of Biotechnology as the Coordinator

6.10 MEDIA CELL

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya (GGV), Bilaspur has established Media Cell since October, 2009, which works as a mirror of the University to the society. Its main objective is to liasioning in the University-society-media interface. One of the main functions is to collect, select and send news and information to the media on behalf of the University. Apart from sending news and information, it also arranges Photography and Videography of different programmes/activities (by way of outsourcing).

The present Media Cell comprises of a Professor In-charge, Public Relation Officer, Hindi Officer and other members nominated by the competent authority of the University from time to time. The Media Cell office is functioning at first floor of the Administrative Building facilitated with latest configuration desk top computer with internet facility, printer, scanner & laptop etc. and other modern facilities.

The Media Cell also organised the Press Conferences from time to time for the comprehensive dissemination of programme mainly like Convocation and International Conference.

During the Financial Year 2018-19, the media cell executed Reporting, Photography & Videography of various programmes:

Media Cell covers the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, NSS, various programmes, Annual Cultural Programmes, the Departmental National/International Conference, Seminar, Workshop, etc.

Apart from reporting, the Media Cell everyday collects newsclips news from 10 National and State News Papers pertaining to University. Shri Amit Baghel updates the account available in University Social Media Website Facebook and various information (news) as well Photographs. The University has linked website with face book. By clicking both the link we may access the face book/website.

The Media Cell uploads all the events/programmes latest photographs in the Web Portal first page photography and provide the same to the website cell.

The Media Cell also keeps record of all function/programme photographs & Video in digital form organised by the University. This facilitates to provide the information as and when required by various departments/section/cell, annual report, newsletter, wall calendar, table calendar, diary face book and web portal, etc. from time to time

6.11 OFFICIAL LANGUAGE CELL

The Official Language Cell was established in the year 2009 in Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya. Initially, it was serving under the Development department of the university. Now it is working as an independent cell. The main goal of the Cell is to compliance Official Language Act, Rules & Policies. The University under the Chairpersonship of Vice-Chancellor, the Official Language Cell Committee meets every quarter regularly. The Official Language Cell sent the quarterly report to the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education on the basis of the data collected from all teaching and non teaching departments. As per official language policy all the name plates, notice boards and seals have been made bilingual. All the forms and documents are also being made bilingual.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

On 14 September, 2018 University celebrates Hindi Diwas Programme. On this occasion, a lecture was delivered by Shri Girij Pankaj, the famous Satirist and Poetry evening was conducted. Likewise, the Matrabhasha Diwas programme was conducted on 21 February, 2019, Shri Satish Jaiswal, Senior Novelist addressed on the Importance of Matrabashha. Further, on this occasion, the faculty members of the University who are from other states read Poetry in their mother languages. The Annual Magazine of the Cell GURU- DARSHAN was inaugurated on 15th January, 2019 on the occasion of the University Establishment Day. The Town Rajbhasha Implementation Committee Bilaspur (C.G.) conducted its second Annual Meet of the year 2018-19 on 23 January, 2019 at South East Central Railway at 4.00 P.M. wherein, Prof. P.J. Mishra, In charge Media Cell participated as GGV Representative.

The Official Language Cell during the Annual Report period translated from English to Hindi, the Feedback form (Total 15 Pages) received from IQAC, Vishwavidyalaya Research Entrance Test (VRET), Vishwavidyalaya Entrance Test (VET) and Notification and its complete guidelines and rules of Rolling Advertisement.

6.12 POST OFFICE AND BANKING

The residents and students on the campus have been provided with banking and communication facilities. The Post Office, the Bank of India and the Punjab National Bank are rendering the services. The Post Office located near the west corner of the University premises, offers services such as, Speed Post service, telephone bill depositing and other facilities. A new electronic telephone exchange has also been established in the campus. The State Bank of India and the Punjab National Bank ATMs are located in the campus and are available round the clock.

6.13 PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELLING CENTRE

As per guidelines of the MHRD, Govt. of India and State Government of Chhattisgarh, State Mental Health Hospital, Sendri, Bilaspur under the National Mental Health programme, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya (a Central University) has established the Psychological Counselling Centre on 29th November, 2016. In order to smooth functioning of the centre, a three member committee has been constituted namely: Prof. P.J. Mishra, Coordinator, and Dr. Payal Banerjee & Dr. Pransanjit Panda its member.

The Psychological Counselling Centre is situated in the Health Centre of the University. In the Health Centre Premises the board of psychological centre is located wherein students of this University can have easy access. The timing of the Centre is 10.30 A.M. to 11.30 A.M., 1 P.M. to 2 P.M. and also 4.30 P.M. to 5.30 P.M. respectively every day. On the outside of the Centre one letter drop box is also kept where students can share their problems to the members of centre at any time, confidentially.

All the members of Counselling Centre continuously and regularly interact with the students to know their personal, group ,society and study problems which are heard seriously, guide them properly and sort out the problems with alternative. Further, in case of emergency, the Counselling Centre provides proper guidance and suggestions to the depressed students.

The Psychological counselling Centre on the commencement of academic session 2018-19, conducted oriented classes in all the teaching dept for depression and removal of its attribute and tension. Also, the Counselling Centre taught the students to keep away from tensions & depression by way of participating educational games.

The Psychological Counselling Centre also ensures the Medical check up of the students in case they suffer from psychological problems. Also, those students who are suffering from depression or psychological problems, the Counselling Centre treats them as a part of the family member and keep their all information confidential.

The University Psychological Counselling Centre and its member playing an important role to the students, employees & teachers to counsel them and also connect them towards the social responsibilities.

6.14 RIGHT TO INFORMATION (RTI) CELL

Right to Information Act 2005 has been implemented in the University within the RTI Cell. During 01 April 2018 to 31 March 2019, 131 RTI applications were received. The applications received from the applicants were sent to the concerned Public Information Officers for providing the information to the applicants. During the period, 33 applications for first appeals were placed before the First Appellate Officer for disposal.

RTI Cell regularly sends the monthly reports to the Ministry of Human Resource Development and Central Information Commissioner for information. Under RTI annual return information system, quarterly return is also uploaded on CIC website well in time in every quarter.

6.15 STD/PCO AND PHOTOCOPYING CORNER

These facilities are available on the campus, one in the administrative building premises and another in the Central Library building. The photocopy centre provides photocopying at subsidized rates as prescribed by the University. Along with photocopy, telephone and FAX facilities are also available. These corners also sell stationary items at reasonable rates.

6.16 SCHEDULED CASTE (SC) / SCHEDULED TRIBE (ST) CELL

The University established a SC/ST cell as per the UGC guidelines in November 1988. The Cell provides assistance to the SC/ST students to receive scholarships as per the government rules and, deals with their problems regarding this. The Cell also observes the reservation policy pursued by the academic departments with regard to admissions. The main objectives of the cell are:

- To assist the SC/ST, OBC, Minorities and Physically challenged students from Chhattisgarh as well as outside C.G. states in getting scholarships.
- To document the details of the SC/ST, OBC, Minorities and Physically challenged students.
- To help the students through counseling.
- To liaison with the government officers at the district and state level in Chhattisgarh and outside C.G. regarding various scholarships.

Reservation and Relaxations Specific to Admission

In accordance with the policy of the Government of India and the guidance of the University Grant Commission, the University has reserved 15% of seats in each course for candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and 7.5% for the candidates belonging to the Scheduled Tribes, with a provision for inter-changeability between the categories, wherever necessary. 27% are reserved for the candidates belonging to OBC category. The relevant certificate for OBC has to be obtained from the same authorities as mentioned for SC/ST categories. Admission against these seats is provided after the candidate has passed the qualifying examination and has appeared in the Vishwavidyalaya Entrance Test (VET).

Government of India Scholarship

The University provides Government of India's SC/ST Welfare Scholarships to the eligible SC and ST students of the University. The scholarships include reimbursement of admission, tuition, examination and hostel fees on the annual basis. 6.18 SPORTS FACILITIES

The Physical Education and Sports department of the University provides and maintains the sports facilities in the campus. The existing sports facilities include, two floodlit basket ball courts. Volley Ball courts, Cricket, Tennis, Floodlight, four Kho-Kho, Badminton courts, Kabaddi courts, Modern Gym, Table-Tennis Hall, Hand-ball ground, Football ground, and Badminton courts in Girls' and Boys' Hostels. These facilities are used by the students, teachers and employees of the campus for their regular sports activities and also for organizing special sports events and competitions at various levels. Training by specialized coaches is provided to the students. The construction of swimming pool of Rs. 1 Crore is in progress.

6.19 CHILDREN PARK

For the welfare of families and children of teaching and non-teaching staff of the University, a children's park was developed in the residential area of University.

It may be noted that all the facilities like swings, sea saw, slide, merry go round, spider web etc. are made from the scrap iron stored in the Department of Physical Education.

7.1 Alumni- Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya

- Department of Journalism also organised its Alumani Meet.

7.2 UNIVERSITY ANTI RAGGING COMMITTEE

Anti -Ragging Committee is constituted in the Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya to prevent ragging and to take anti ragging measures as per the guidelines issued by the Supreme Court of India, GOI & UGC from time to time.

Administrative action in the event of ragging in GGV: -

Following regulations were established by the Anti-Ragging Committee to punish the guilty depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt. If found guilty, one or more of the following punishments will be awarded, namely:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- Cancellation of admission.
- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- Expulsion from the University and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the GGV shall resort to collective punishment.

"No instance of Ragging is reported in the Academic session 2018-19."

Measures Taken by Anti Ragging Committee in GGV:

- Anti ragging display boards and banners informing the students of the evils of ragging and the possible administrative actions in the event of ragging, were displayed around the campus. This will help in making GGV, a ragging free University and a place for peaceful living for students without any fear of ragging.
- The GGV started the academic session of UG and PG programme on 1st July, 2018.
- Under the pretext of 'welcoming' new students to the Anti Ragging Cell of the GGV, an induction programme was organized in Each School of Studies, to aware the students about rules, regulation and punishments related to ragging.
- All the students as well as their parents have submitted the hard copy of the undertaking / affidavits to the concerned HOD and also submitted proof of online affidavits on AMAN MOVEMENT website themselves, as directed by the UGC and MHRD.
- The students were advised that they shall not indulge in "RAGGING". If they are found guilty of ragging they are liable for the above mentioned punishment.
- The freshers / junior students were also instructed that they should not respond to the calls from seniors, and shall not tolerate any atrocities against them. This will ensure that the freshers are able to pursue their studies without getting teased, insulted or in any way troubled by the seniors in the name of an obsolete, barbaric ritual.
- We also monitored, for prevention of ragging, those commercially managed places/ private hostels where our students are relying for accommodation.

7.3 ANTI-DISCRIMINATION CELL

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya has established Anti-Discrimination Cell (ADC) for effectively controlling any discrimination against religion, caste, creed, gender etc. in the University against the students, faculty and staff. Prof. V.D. Rangari, Head, Department of Pharmacy has been appointed as Anti-Discrimination Officer.

In this regard, the Anti-Discrimination Cell works in coordination with all the Departments of GGV, in the year 2018-2019, No complaint was received by the ADC, from the students, faculty and staff.

7.5 EK BHARAT SHERESHTHA BHARAT (EBSB)

On 9/08/2018 under the banner of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat essay competition on "Role of Gujarat in the Independence of India" has been organised in which 37 students of different faculties were participated.

On 29/08/2018 with the help of Department of Physical Education Cross Country race was organised under the banner of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat. In this competition about 85 students of the University celebrated the cultural and language exchange programme, of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat series of events from 19th January to 24th January 2019 with the paired team from Gujarat Central University, Gandhinagar Gujarat. 10 students (5 boys and 5 girls) of GGV visited CUG from from 17-2-2019 to 22-2-2019 to visit Kutch Rann Festival and to learn art, culture and tourist spot of Kutch are of Gujrat.

7.6 EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL (EOC)

Equal opportunity cell is an important initiative with emphasis on the deprived groups for learning and creating space for them. It also runs specific scheme of coaching for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, OBC (non-creamy layer), Minorities in order to enhance the employability and success.

The major initiatives include coaching for UGC CSIR NET, UGC NET, UPSC and PSC coaching and Remedial coaching for English

The details of the activities are as under;

English Remedial Coaching

In the session 2018-19 a total of 59 students registered for the remedial English classes. Out of 59, 22 were of OBC, SC 10, ST 11 and General 16. The classes were held at University Teaching Department and the Teachers from Department of English actively conducted the classes.

UPSC Coaching

The service entry level including for Union Public Service Commission and State Public Service Commission was held in the Session 2018-19 at University Teaching Departments. Teachers from various Departments held more than 30 classes during the session. A total of 110 students from different categories attended the coaching.

UGC/CSIR NET Coaching

The coaching for the National Eligibility Test was held at various Departments for specific subjects through subject coordinator. The coaching was held for students of Life Sciences, Physical Sciences, and Arts.Students from concerned faculties and of different categories attended the coaching.

7.7 GENDER CHAMPION

Introduction

To increase the outreach for creating an environment that fosters equal treatment, Government of India envisages engagement of Gender Champions in all schools and colleges across the country.

Gender Champions can be both, boys and girls above 16 years of age, enrolled in educational institutions. It is a joint initiative of the Ministry of women and Child Development and Ministry of Human Resource Development.

Vision

Gender Champions are envisaged as responsible leaders who will facilitate an enabling environment within their schools/colleges/academic institutions where girls are treated with dignity and respect. They will strengthen the potential of young girls and boys to advocate for gender equality and monitor progress towards gender justice.

Objective

The broad mandate of a Gender Champion is to provide an integrated and interdisciplinary approach for understanding the social and cultural constructions of gender that shape the experiences of women and men in the society. The aim is to make the young boys and girls, gender sensitive and create positive social norms that value the girls and their rights. These digital depositories have ensured hardware, network facilities and software of prescribed quality for smooth and secured operationalisation of NAD.

It is a Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India Programme implemented to involve higher education institutes for technological transfer for the transformational change in rural development processes by leveraging knowledge higher institutions. Since September, 2015 community development cell and Unnat Bharat Abhiyan cell was constituted and 05 members team was appointed including one Nodal Officer Dr. K. K. Chandra, Associate Professor, Department of Forestry, Wildlife & Environmental Sciences. Under UBA 04 Gram Panchayats (GPs) Pudu, Rigwar, Tendubhata and Umariadadar, comprising 09 villages of Kota Block, Bilaspur, dominated with tribal population has adopted.

UBA team visits every Friday to the villages of adopted GPs to meet villagers and discusses their problems. The identified problems of the villagers are then conveyed to district authorities for

appropriate solutions and also for the implementation of different schemes in these adopted GPs. Thus UBA team is playing its role developing linkages between villages and District Authority.

The following activities were taken during 2018-19 under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan program:-

- Gram sabha meetings were organized in all 04 gram panchayats where Sarpanch, Gram Sachiv and other member and villagers of the villages were invited for preparing of effective village development plan (VDP) of adopted villages.
- Fruit plants of 1000 nos namely Moringa, lemon, Guava, Kathal and papaya were distributed to students of Pudu, Rigwar, Umariyadadar and Pachra school with aims to facilitate balance nutrition especially to girl students of rural area and also tomotivate for tree planting and nature care. Improved variety of bamboo was also provided free of cost to farmers of Tendubhatha for planning.
- Swachhta hee seva program was initiated in Umariyadadar and Rigwar village in September- October months where swachhta rally was organized by 150 NSS volunteers of the Vishwavidyalaya. CEO Janpad Panchayat Kota, Kunal Dudawat (IAS) was chief guest in this programme. Villagers were encouraged against alcohol drinking, girls' education, and health issues through nukkad natak and play programmes.
- Two programmes on legal and fundamental rights awareness were organized for 96 rural students and villagers in Umariyadadar and Pudu, where a group of LLB students from GGV explained about fundamental rights and legal safety of citizen.
- Promotion of Swachha bharat scheme was done in all adopted villages resultantly 03 adopted GPs has been declared ODF while last one has also completed 90% target of toilet construction. UBA team regularly visits to beneficiaries of this scheme and promotes its use.
- PM Ujwala Yojna has been promoted in all adopted villages resultantly more than 400 poor families now possess their own LPG cylinders.
- Two mushroom Training cum demonstration programme was organized for 55 women and rural youth of Rigwar and Tendubhata village under skill development programme. Free span of mushroom was distributed to beneficiaries for mushroom production.
- One day workshop on home herbal and kitchen garden was organized in Umariyadadar adopted village for 38 participants. Traditional healers of vaidyasangh and UBA team member displayed different herbs for identification and use in controlling diseases at local level as well as the conservation of forest.
- Village development plan (VDP) of all 04 gram panchayats (GPs) has been prepared and uploaded to unnat bharat abhiyan portal of GOI successfully. The adopted villages has been surveyed and data collected in different parameters has also already uploaded in UBA portal.

- Seven proposal of technology transfer based on priority areas of Chhattisgarh Government Narwa, Ghurwa, Garua and Bari (NGGB) has been prepared by UBA team member of the University which is being submitted to Jila Panchayat for its funding and implementation in adopted villages.
- To develop competitiveness among rural students 04 painting competition and easy writing competition were conducted in school of all adopted GPs and prizes were distributed to participants.
- Badminton items, football and other sports items were donated to Sekar, Pachra, Rigwar and Tendubhatha schools to promote sports activities since primary education.
- Forty students of B.Sc./ BA anthropology were attached for 10 days to Umariyadadar village for survey of tribal families and study of their culture and customs.
- Four farmers were given seeds of Jimikand (Improved variety) for commercial cultivation. To improve the agriculture income of the farmers, biofungicides and trichoderma were distributed for seedling treatment in Rigwar and Pachra village.

7.17 INNOVATION COUNCIL

CU Integrated Portal is developed by UGC for focussed Planning, Financing, Administration and coordinated development of Central. The aims of this portal include encouraging paper less transactions between CUs, UGC & MHRD. Mr. H.N. Choubey, Joint Registrar is appointed Nodal Officer on 14 August, 2017 for the portal. UGC has provided user ID and password to the Nodal

Officer to fill up in various prescribed forms provided by UGC for teaching/non-teaching student strength expenditure details, etc.

The CU Portal opens on 1st to 10th of every month. The Nodal Officer collects the data from all concerned teaching/non-teaching departments and fills the prescribed forms provided by UGC on every month in the CU Portal within stipulated time. This helps, Central Universities, MHRD & UGC to update the records. The Nodal Officer regularlyuploads the data in the CU Integrated Portal

7.19 WOMEN'S ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Entrepreneurship Development cell of GGV conducted a 4 weeks Women's entrepreneurship development programme. This programme was conducted by Chhattisgarh Entrepreneurship Development Centre, a government registered society in association with Entrepreneurship Development cell of GGU whose nodal officer is Dr. V. Mandal. The programme was funded by DST, New Delhi. It was a 4 week training programme and 25 science graduates (girls) of GGU participated in the programme. The duration of the programme was from 25.2.109 - 28.3.2019. No registration fee was charged from the participants. The programme consisted of lectures from different successful entrepreneurs of Chhattisgarh especially women entrepreneurs who discussed various case studies with the participants. Bank officials and different NGO's were also invited for giving an insight picture of handling funds in entrepreneurship. An industrial tour of Tifra Industrial area of Bilaspur was also conducted under the programme.

University has plan to introduce Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) as compulsory course which carry 4 credits, to be included in the CBCS curriculum from academic session 2019-20 for III and IV semester students of Undergraduate programme.

University Elective Courses

A New Course introduced by the University as University Elective Course (UEC) will be included in the CBCS curriculum as an additional course which carries credits (30 Hours course duration) and will be offered two times in UG 3 year degree programme; three time in 4 years degree programme and four times in 5 years degree programmes.

University elective course may include Value Added courses, Yoga and Meditation, NSS, Study / Educational / Excursion Tour / Industrial Visit, Industrial Training, Swachhata, Sport Activity, Cultural Activities, Community service through recognized agency, Helping Government based programmes, MOOCs Courses on Swayam platform of 2 credit, Any certificate course of the University with 30 hours minimum course time, any other course notified by the University from time to time.

The University is actively involved in creating skilled manpower for industry requirements at various levels

Value Added Courses: A new initiative by the GGV

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya will offer a wide variety of short term certificate courses as Value added courses (Minimum of 30 Hour duration per semester with 2 additional credits) which will be conducted along with semester classes. Value added courses will be designed and offered by departments for the benefit of the students. These courses will be conducted by Expert Teachers and help students stand apart from the rest in the job market by adding further value to their resume. For each value added course 2 additional credits will be awarded. So each student leaving Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya with a Degree may have completed any two value added courses.

The University has fully implemented the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for the undergraduate programmes from the session 2018-19. Skill Enhancement Courses in B.Sc. (Hons.) /B.A. (Hons.)/ BE / B. Pharm / B.Ed and B.P.Ed Programme were included where these value-based and/or skill-based courses are aimed to provide hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

7.21 SWACHCHH BHARAT

Background of Swachchh Bharat Summer Internship Programme:

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya has implemented the Swachh Bharat Summer Internship programme as community related service from session 2017-18. This program is pursuance of the objectives of the Swachh Bharat Mission launched as a national movement on October 2nd, 2014, the Ministry of Human Resource Development, in association with the Swachh Bharat Mission (Garmin), Ministry of Drinking Water & Sanitation and Ministry of youth affairs is launching a 'Swachh Bharat Summer Internship' programme. The University Grants Commission, vide their letter dated 23rd March, 2018 qualified this internship as being eligible for (2) academic credits like an optional paper.


