### Syllabus for M.A. English Semester Course (2014-15 onwards)

M.A. Course in English shall comprise 4 semesters. Each semester shall have 4 courses and Optional papers wherever applicable. In all, there shall be 16 courses. Each course shall carry 100 marks. Of these, 60 marks shall be reserved for theory (end-Semester examination) and 40 marks for tutorials/seminars (internal assessment).

However, in course 5, titled "Linguistics and English Language Teaching", only 40 marks shall be reserved for theory (end-Semester examination), 20 marks for Practical/Viva-voce exam and 40 marks for tutorial/seminars (internal assessment).

The theory component of each paper shall be of three hours' duration.


##### Section A


