About the University

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, is a Central University of India, located in Bilaspur C.G. State, established under Central Universities Act 2009, No. 25 of 2009. Outline of the Workshop

The workshop basically intends to disseminate the findings of the ICSSR-sponsored short term collaborative project entitled "Climate Shocks, Insurance Adoption and Farmers' Welfare in Select Areas of Eastern India: Assessing the Impact of PMFBY on Farm Productivity". The main objectives of the project were to

1. Identify the major climatic risks that farmers face and assess the level of insurance adoption as a crucial adaptation strategy.

2. Explore the structural issues in PMFBY viz. crop notification, the accessibility and

adequacy of insurance coverage, procedural transparency, and the effectiveness of

grievance redressal mechanisms. Additionally, examine the participation levels of

stakeholders in PMFBY from diverse social and size-holding categories of farmers.

3. Evaluate the impact of PMFBY on various aspects of agriculture, including farm productivity, technology adoption, crop diversification, and the overall indebtedness of

farmers.

The study has gathered field level data from 2100 farm households spreading across 12

Blocks of Odisha, Chhattisgarh and eastern Uttar Pradesh. In addition, information was also

gathered from Block Agriculture Officers, Insurance Companies, and Common Service

Centres (CSCs). The study could grasp some important insights on functioning and socio-

economic impact of PMFBY. Policy suggestions and recommendations are given based on

the findings of the project. The workshop intends to have some intensive discussion with

diverse stake-holders of the flagship scheme based on the findings of the research project.

The results of the study are diverse in nature. In Odisha and Chhattisgarh, insurance adoption

is very high in the cases of loanee farmers. Although the scheme has become voluntary since

2020 even for the loanee farmers, most farmers adopt insurance by default. In Odisha, the

state government has started insuring upto 2 hectares of land per farmer at just Re 1 with

effect from Kharif 2023. This pricing intervention has put the affordability question to rest.

Insurance adoption has become near universal in Kharif 2023. However, a closure scrutiny

of the PMFBY numbers vis-à-vis NSSO-2019 data, especially for Balangir district, shows

some different pictures. The narrative in Uttar Pradesh is quite different from Odisha and

Chhattisgarh. The workshop will throw light on all these revelations from the field level

investigation.
